‘Learning to Save Lives with Human Patient Simulators’

Dr Eugene Lloyd is a senior teaching fellow at the University of Bristol, a clinical assistant in emergency medicine and dental pre-clinical dean. He aims to encourage undergraduates to learn physiological principles that they can apply in clinical practice. His research interests include the novel use of Human Patient Simulators for biomedical sciences education. These simulation sessions are designed to build upon learning from practicals and tutorials. They provide opportunities for students to take a hands-on approach to learning in a safe environment and experience “physiology in action”.
