‘Saving the Lives of HIV Positive Patients’

Dr Stuart Glover is Consultant Physician at Southmead Hospital, Bristol. He qualified in medicine from Aberdeen University in 1972 where he completed his general medicine training. In 1980 he spent time in the Regional Infectious Diseases department in Birmingham working with Professor Alasdair Geddes followed by an attachment to St Thomas's Hospital in London. He was appointed Consultant in Communicable Diseases in Bristol in 1981. He is currently lead clinician for HIV services, infectious diseases and tropical diseases based at Southmead Hospital, Bristol. He is fully involved in the acute medical take and maintains an active interest in the generality of medicine in an era of increasing specialisation and "discontinuous medical practice". His talk will trace the development of HIV as a modern epidemic and will be liberally illustrated with clinical cases from his personal experience
